**AMENDMENT NO. 6 TO  
EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 04-20  
BY THE MAYOR**

**WHEREAS**, Governor Kay Ivey announced the state's coronavirus pandemic public health order and state of emergency will end on Tuesday, July 6, 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, I, Gary Fuller, as Mayor of the City of Opelika, by the authority vested in me by the applicable provisions and laws of the State of Alabama and Ordinance No. 008-20 of the Opelika City Council adopted on March 17, 2020, declare the public health emergency in Opelika has passed. The powers delegated to me by the City Council will terminate as follows:

Section 1. Effective July 6, 2021, all City-owned and operated buildings and facilities located within the City of Opelika will be open to the public. For the purposes of this Ordinance, City-owned and operated buildings and facilities include: City Hall, the Lewis Cooper Memorial Library, all Public Works Facilities, all Recreation Department Facilities, the Police Department, all Fire Departments, senior centers, recycling centers, wastewater treatment plants, and other City buildings, facilities, and properties.

Section 2. All Recreation Department programs and classes, including adult and youth sports programs, may resume. All City owned and operated parks are open.

Section 3. Municipal Court trials have resumed.

Section 4. All City-sponsored events may resume.

Section 5. Residents can continue to access most City services by telephone, email and online. Public safety, utilities, solid waste collection and other essential services continue as normal.

Section 6. Access to City Council meetings will now be open to the public.

Section 7. The City's website (<https://www.opelika-al.gov>) will be regularly updated with current information.

Section 8. In the event the State Health Officer implements a state-wide order that is more restrictive or stringent, then the order of the State Health Officer shall take precedence.

Section 9. To the extent that this Order is in conflict with other executive orders, this Order shall supersede the others until this Order is amended or repealed.
